
Print Guidelines

SLUG

An area outside the bleed, extra space for utility and notes needed during production that you wouldn't want to print. Unlike bleed, the slug is not necessary but can be helpful.



CROP MARKS

(aka trim marks) are small lines placed in the corners of print-ready artwork. Used to indicate the intended edges of the final printed product. They simply tell the printer where to trim.


BLEED

Bleed extends the printed design slightly beyond the edge of the final cut size to ensure no white space.

PAGE EDGE (TRIM)

MARGINS

A Margin is a white or blank space between the main content and the top, bottom, and edges of the page. Adding a margin keeps important elements from being cut off during trimming.



- **A7:** 74mm x 105mm 80mm x 111mm with bleed
- A6: 105mm x 148mm 111mm x 154mm with bleed
- A5: 148mm x 210mm 154mm x 216mm with bleed
- A4: 210mm x 297mm 216mm x 303mm with bleed
- A3: 297mm x 420mm 303mm x 426mm with bleed
- **A2:** 420mm x 594mm 426mm x 600mm with bleed
- A1: 594mm x 841mm 600mm x 847mm with bleed
- A0: 841mm x 1189mm 847mm x 1195mm with bleed
- DL: 210mm x 99mm 216mm x 105mm with bleed

Business Cards:

85mm x 55mm 91mm x 61mm with bleed
